

Service Provider - Key Points for May:

- 1. Clear Guidelines and Expectations:** Establish comprehensive guidelines outlining the expectations for service providers when visiting Woorabinda to collaborate with Council. Include details on the services they provide, reporting requirements, and expected outcomes.
 - 2. Pre-Visit Briefing:** Aiming to Conduct a pre-visit briefing session for service providers to familiarize them with the community's culture, needs, and any specific protocols they need to follow during their visit. For example, a welcome video to view before visiting or while visiting.
 - 3. Accountability Mechanisms:** Establish accountability mechanisms to ensure that service providers adhere to the agreed-upon guidelines and deliver quality services. This could involve periodic reviews of their performance, addressing any discrepancies or concerns raised, and implementing consequences for non-compliance or substandard performance.
 - 4. Continuous Improvement:** Encourage a culture of continuous improvement by soliciting feedback from both service providers and community members, identifying areas for enhancement, and implementing changes to optimize the delivery of services over time.
